Topic: Content Area 8: The care planning cycle



What BIG IDEAS will you cover in this topic?

In this content area you will learn about the purpose and impact of purpose centred practice and the care planning cycle.

Powerful knowledge: what important prior knowledge will you use from your prior learning?

You have already developed a strong understanding of the different types, purposes, and functions of health and social care provision and services. You have also explored the various job roles within the sector, along with the key legislation, policies, and procedures that guide professional practice. You have studied human lifespan development. You have considered how care needs change across different stages of life and how services can support individuals at each stage. You have learned about the different types of referrals used to access health and social care services, as well as the various barriers that individuals may face when trying to access these services. You have considered partnership working and how this meets the needs of individuals, you will explore the barriers to partnership working. You will now explore the care planning cycle and the purpose and impact of person centred care.

You have already studied Content Areas 1,2, 3, 4, 5,6 and 7. You are now studying Content Area 8.

You will explore what a care plan is, its key features, and how it supports individuals' needs, preferences, and goals. Finally, you will examine the stages of the care planning cycle, understanding how it is used in practice to assess, plan, implement, and review care to ensure it remains effective and responsive to changing needs.
